

I. PURPOSE

The purpose of this policy is to clearly define the locations, times, and seasons when varying activities are permitted on AOAA properties, and to delegate the authority to grant permission to enter upon the lands.

II. DEFINITIONS

AOAA	Includes AOAA Lands as well as other property leased or owned by the AOAA as well as easements granted to the AOAA by other landowners for use by the AOAA.
AOAA Lands	Property leased by the NC AOAAA from the County of Northumberland pursuant to a lease dated January 29, 2013.
AOAA Eastern Reserve	All AOAA Lands East of State Route 125.
AOAA Western Reserve	All AOAA Lands West of State Route 125.
Motorized Activities	Operating a motorized vehicle of any type (other than a motorized wheelchair) on AOAA Lands other than designated parking or entry road areas.
Non-Motorized Activities	All methods of fishing, hunting game (as permitted by any local state or federal laws, rules or regulations including the Pennsylvania Fish and Game Commission), hiking, walking, non-motorized biking, or other similar non-motorized activities and shall include motorized wheelchair access.
Non-Motorized Activity Season	On days the AOAA is opened to motorized recreation: The period of time from 30 minutes prior to dawn until the scheduled AOAA opening to motorized recreation. On days the park is not opened to motorized recreation: The period from 30 minutes prior to dawn until 30 minutes after dusk
AOAA Rifle Deer Season	The period of time from 30 minutes prior to dawn until 30 minutes after dusk, between the first Monday of rifle deer season as set forth by the Pennsylvania Game Commission (typically the Monday following Thanksgiving) and extending for two weeks, ending no earlier than the second Saturday after the first Monday of the season.

Activities during AOAA Rifle Deer Season are only permitted on AOAA Lands. Any hunting must be as permitted by local state or federal laws, rules or regulations, including the Pennsylvania Fish and Game Commission and nothing in this policy is intended to supersede the same. All hunters and fishers, who are hunting and fishing, must possess a valid Pennsylvania hunting or fishing license respectively, follow all rules and regulations of the Pennsylvania Fish or Game Commissions and, if using or accessing AOAA Lands from adjacent lands or entering adjacent lands from AOAA Lands, must obtain permission from said adjacent landowners.

Hunters, fishermen, hikers, walkers, non-motorized bikers, and other similar non-motorized participants **will not be required** to request permission or obtain permission slips or execute waivers of liability as is otherwise required for access to the AOAA.

V. MISCELANEOUS.

Hunting, fishing, hiking, walking, and non-motorized biking, as well as other similar activities are an unsupervised and conducted at the user's own risk, and the same are limited to walk in/bike in only.

In the case of hunting, any individual who has previously obtained permission from the Pennsylvania Game Commission to hunt from his or her vehicle may provide written proof of the same, five business (5) days in advance of a hunting season, to the AOAA Director of Operations and will be granted access to the property to conduct the activity in the event no other conflict exists.

Any questions as to which lands are encompassed by the January 29, 2013 lease between the NC AOAAA and the County of Northumberland should be directed to the AOAA Director of Operations. It shall be the responsibility of those entering the AOAA or AOAA Lands to know the boundaries of the same.

NOTE: All users of AOAA Lands, whether for motorized activity or non-motorized activity, must obey all applicable rules and regulations as adopted for users, a list of rules and regulations is attached and from time to time may be updated.
